<u>Key information</u>

- On arrival, please sign in. You will be issued with a badge, please ensure this is visible at all times.
- Please do not use mobile phones in the presence of the children.
- Please do not take photographs unless agreed with a member of staff.
- If you are concerned about the conduct of an adult in school, please inform a member of the Safeguarding Team (Miss Ewbank, Mrs. Regan or Mrs. Matheson). If your concern is about the Headteacher, please notify the Chair of Governors.
- Please ensure that you have read key documentation, copies are available in the school office (Keeping Children Safe in Education; Hipswell Child Protection Policy; Hipswell Safeguarding One Minute Guide).

Safeguarding concerns about a child

If a child makes a disclosure to you:

- React calmly and do not appear shocked.
- Listen carefully and reassure the child that they are doing the right thing by talking to a trusted adult.
- Do not promise confidentiality and explain that you will need to share the information with the headteacher in order to keep them safe.
- Do not ask leading questions or make judgements.

Any concerns about a child, or a child disclosure, must be shared with a member of the Safeguarding Team as soon as possible.

Emergency procedures

Fire

Any person discovering a fire must:

- Operate the nearest fire alarm and dial 999.
- Evacuate the building.

On hearing the fire alarm:

- Evacuate the building by the nearest exit.
- If working with the children, escort them to the assembly point (school field).
- Ensure all fire doors are closed behind you.

Lockdown

Any person discovering an intruder should immediately notify the headteacher or member of the admin team who will contact the Police and raise the alarm.

In the event of a lockdown situation:

- Return to/remain in classroom.
- Close all blinds, windows and doors.
- Ensure children remain silent and calm.
- Await further instructions.

<u>First aid</u>

All staff are first aid trained.
