During the first week of term all of the children will be invited to bring one parent to school for an induction day. The day will begin at 9.15am and Mrs Price and Mrs Hobson will meet you at the main school entrance. Parents can accompany their child into the classroom and once they are settled the parent can leave. Children will have lunch at school and will be collected from the main school gate at 3.15pm.

For the second and third week we will have half of the class staying for the full week. We have split the class into two groups by date of birth, with the oldest children attending first. During this week the school day will start at 9.15 and finish at 3.15 and Mrs Price and Mrs Hobson will collect and dismiss the class from the main school entrance.

On Monday 28th September, at the beginning of the fourth week we welcome all the reception pupils at 9:15am until 3:15pm.

By organising this staggered approach, we hope to give the children a smooth and successful start to their school year.
