Year 4 Autumn Term



This termly newsletter is to keep you informed of just some of the specific topics the children will be working on this term, alongside English and Mathematics.

Topic - 'Children at War'

The children will learn about what it was like for children during WW2. The topic will cover several different curriculum subjects, including History, Geography, Art and DT.



It will also be linked to English where we will be reading books linked to World War 2.

Science - 'Sound and electricity'

During this unit, they will explore and identify the way sound is made through vibration, find out how the pitch and volume of sounds can be changed in a variety of ways and recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound increases. In electricity, they will learn how to construct a simple circuit, including a switch and a lamp. They will also learn to recognise common conductors and insulators.

Computing

"Coding" The children will understand that when a computer does something its following instructions called code.

Children will learn about the importance of keeping themselves safe online. Please reinforce this important message at home.

Religious Education -

'What kind of world did Jesus want?'

The children will learn about how Jesus made the calling of the first disciples, how Christians today try to follow Jesus and be 'fishers of people'



and Bible stories such as Jesus' actions towards the leper and the Good Samaritan.

Music - 'Harvest and 1940's'

In their music sessions, the children will listen to and sing a selection of 1940s popular songs and prepare for the Harvest festival.

After half term, the children will learn Christmas songs.
